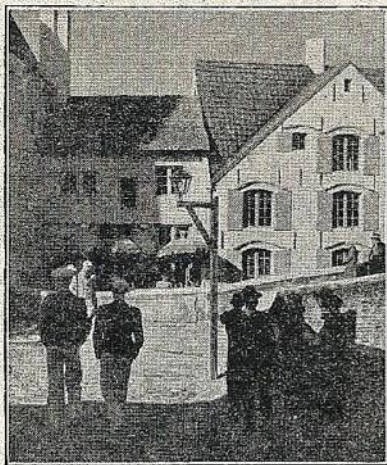

BELGIAN VILLAGE

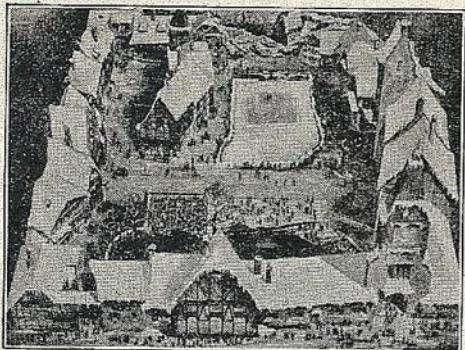

IRISH VILLAGE

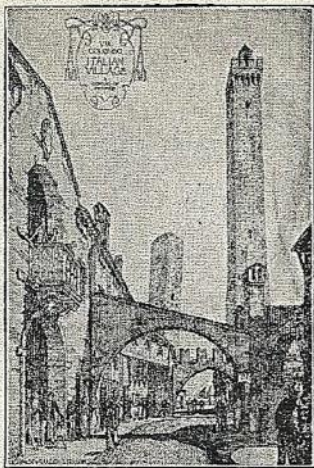

The story begins in Tara Hall, an historic replica of the famous assembly hall in which the law givers of Ireland met to plan the rebuilding of Western Europe after the crash of the Roman Empire.

Reminders of every period of Irish history and every section of Ireland are brought into the settings, which house with beauty a program of Irish music, song and story telling, enlivened by beautiful Irish dances.

ITALIAN VILLAGE

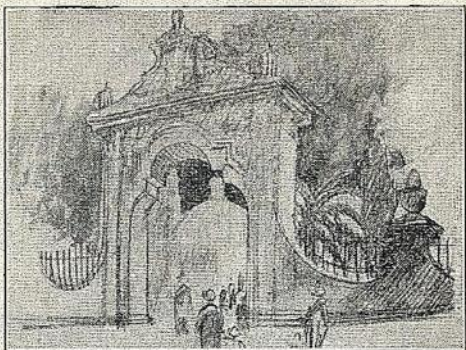

STREETS OF TUNIS

Right from the heart of the deserts of North Africa, on the Mediterranean come the Arabs, the Bedouins, and the slave dancers who make "The Streets of Tunis" one of the spiciest and liveliest spots at the World's Fair. The beautiful buildings of "Streets of Tunis", designed by Daniel H. Burnham and built by F. J. Bageman, Inc., authentically reproduce the harems, merchant bazars, mosques, theaters, and pavilions for dining and recreation, just as they are in Tunisia today. Famous Arabian wares can be bought in the shops. Harem dancing girls, Arab soldiers demonstrating sword fighting and gun spinning, and a troupe of Arab acrobats, provide a program of real entertainment.

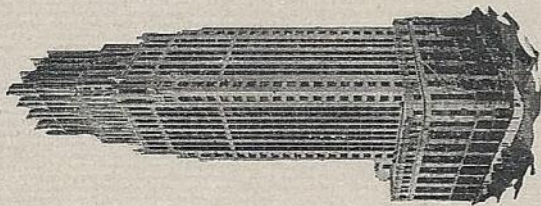
